The in school gap for RWM between Pupil Premium Pupils(PP) and their peers was 16%. The national gap was 19%. We have a smaller 'in school' gap than national.

The MBMS PP children are 11% behind national non Pupil Premium pupils. The national average for this statistic is 19%. This means MBMS PP pupils are significantly closer to non PP children than national average. This is securely good and shows our strategy is working.

Current school priorities on the SEF

- Further close disadvantaged pupils gaps.
- To ensure consistent provision across the school, for the rapidly expanding and highly specific SEN cohort.
- To ensure the teachers who have monitoring activities which fall below expectations are given immediate, face-to-face feedback and training plans in place to address these issues.
- Further improve teaching across the school, by sharing good practice across different subjects.
- Improve leadership capacity to eradicate the shrinking inconsistencies at middle leadership.
