

## Disadvantaged Students Impact Statement 2016-17

In 2016/17 Marden Bridge Middle School received £139,875 in Pupil Premium funding, and we have effectively utilised this to secure improved outcomes for our **disadvantaged pupils**:

56% of 2016/17 year 8 DP pupils are classed as mobile, having joined Marden Bridge as in year transfers. Internal tracking shows us that the longer that DP pupils attend Marden Bridge the better their attainment is in yr8 when they leave.
