

Pupil Premium Impact Statement 2018-19

In 2018/19 Marden Bridge Middle School received £142,780 in Pupil Premium (PP) funding, and we have effectively utilised this to secure improved outcomes for our **disadvantaged pupils**:

The combined gap for Reading, Writing and Maths between Pupil Premium Pupils (PP) and their peers was 16%. The national gap was 19%. **We have a smaller 'in school' gap than national.**

The MBMS PP children are 11% behind national non Pupil Premium pupils. The national average for this statistic is 19%. **This means MBMS PP pupils are significantly closer to non PP children than national average.**

For our 2019 yr8 pupil premium cohort, 29% joined us during KS3, with 45% not completing the full four years at MBMS. The data below demonstrates the gaps compared to their 2017 SAT outcomes.
